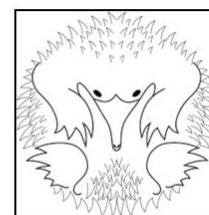

Purpose

The Postgraduate Medical Council of Victoria (PMCV) in collaboration with Emma Leehane (Nangala Aboriginal Cultural Education) has developed a cultural awareness training module with a focus on Indigenous Australian culture and associated healthcare issues and considerations.

The training provides cultural awareness education that:

1. includes an overview of the key issues relevant to the development of a culturally safe health service environment for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
2. leads to an increase in culturally safe and sensitive practice amongst health care professionals

Workshop Format

The workshop will incorporate theoretical / historical components with practical small group application activities focusing on working with Indigenous patients.

Workshop Content

- History of Australian Indigenous culture
- Health perspectives of Indigenous Australians
- Current health issues affecting Indigenous Australians
- Strategies to promote culturally sensitive/safe practice
- Scenarios based on health worker experiences dealing with Indigenous patients
