2 Diagnostic Tool



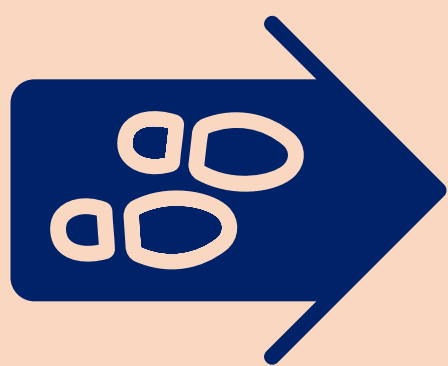
EPAs can identify strengths and weaknesses, allowing supervisors to better tailor assessments.
