

## Transitional arrangements for PGY1 in 2024

### Introduction

Prevocational medical training is changing from 2024 for postgraduate year one (PGY1) doctors. This document outlines the transitional arrangements for the following cohort of doctors.

### **PGY1 doctors who don't complete intern requirements in the 2023 year**

2023 (and earlier years) PGY1 doctors who do not complete intern requirements by 30 January 2024 will be considered to have met the requirements for general registration by completing:

- 47 weeks full-time equivalent (FTE) experience consisting of:
  - at least eight weeks in emergency medical care
  - at least 10 weeks in medicine
  - at least 10 weeks in surgery, and
  - a range of other approved terms to make up 12 months (minimum of 47 weeks FTE).

The terms must be accredited to **either, or both**, the pre-2024 or post 2024 accreditation standards.

The Board understands that terms will be accredited differently from 2024. The Board will be flexible with requirements but expects PGY1 doctors to have:

- broad based accredited experience in a range of disciplines (as described above),
- written confirmation from either the Director of Clinical Training, the Director of Medical Services, the Assessment Review Panel Chair or other authorised person acceptable to the Board that the PGY1 doctor has been awarded an overall satisfactory rating by the end of the PGY1 year based on end of term assessments.
