Summary	<p>Required Clinical year position x2 (Box Hill Hospital): This is an accredited Required Clinical Year for advanced training in endocrinology. It is based at Box Hill Hospital in Melbourne's eastern suburbs. The incumbent has responsibility for inpatients and inpatient referrals at Box Hill Hospital and attends five clinics. Clinics include a thyroid clinic, a general endocrine and diabetes clinic, gestational diabetes clinic and a community-based type 2 diabetes clinic. In addition there is an monthly evening type 1 diabetes clinic.</p> <p>Box Hill (RCY): There is the support of a full time HMO and students are attached to the unit in rotation. Four consultants share the ward service. There are weekly unit meetings, journal club and endocrine roundtable and ESAP educational meetings as well as a fortnightly Monash Partners inter-hospital meeting. It is expected that the incumbent will complete a research project and present the results at the national meeting.</p>

Summary	<p>Launceston General Hospital is a busy teaching hospital in a regional city with a mix of city and country charms, nestled in the Tasmanian wilderness. This is an accredited 12-months core position, and the unit registrar will be involved with both inpatient consultation and outpatient clinics, and teaching of medical students and junior medical staff, in addition to presentation at weekly unit Journal Club meetings.</p> <p>The registrar is expected to work interactively with our multidisciplinary team consisting of four consultants, 1-2 BPT registrars, diabetes nurse educators, diabetes dietitian, nurse practitioner, podiatrists, and a psychologist. There are 4-5 clinics per week: 2 general endocrine clinics, 1-2 general diabetes clinic (young adults, Type 1 on pumps, high-risk diabetes foot, and complex other diabetes) and a high-risk antenatal clinic once a month. After-hours on-call service currently is limited to maternity patients with a roster of one week in four.</p> <p>There is also opportunity to attend outreach clinics to the East Coast of Tasmania in St Helen's, and attendance of CGMS or insulin pump start sessions.</p> <p>Our team also participates in regular pituitary MDT meetings with Royal Hobart Hospital to co-ordinate care of our patients who have had or will have their pituitary surgery in Hobart as well as coordinating the care of our patients who live more remotely.</p>

Summary	<p>Two identical RCY positions are available at the Royal Hobart Hospital.</p> <p>The Royal Hobart Hospital is Tasmania's tertiary hospital and the major teaching hospital of the University of Tasmania. The Hospital is the State Referral Centre for cardiothoracic surgery, neurosurgery, burns, hyperbaric and diving medicine, neonatal intensive care and high risk obstetrics. The Royal Hobart Hospital is committed to providing co-ordinated, high-quality care that is responsive to community needs. The hospital is fully accredited and has an enviable reputation</p>

Our RHH Research Foundation promotes and funds medical, healthcare and biomedical research.</p> <p>The Department of Diabetes and Endocrine Services is a broad-based unit which operates within Medicine and Pathology Services. There are six Endocrinologists attached to the Unit. The activities of the Department are supported by two APT Endocrinology Registrars and Resident Medical Officer. The Department provides extensive inpatient and outpatient consultative services as well as admitting patients with diabetes and endocrinological problems directly under its care.</p> <p>The Department of Diabetes and Endocrine Services is responsible for the operation of a NATA Accredited Endocrinology Laboratory. Services provided by the laboratory include a broad range of automated and RAI assays as well as a molecular endocrinology service for genetic screening for Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1. The Department plays an important role in both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and has an active research program in diabetes, thyroidology and Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1.</p> <p>Advanced Trainees in Endocrinology at the Royal Hobart Hospital receive training and experience in all dimensions of Departmental activities – inpatient and outpatient management, operation of the Endocrinology Laboratory and diabetes and endocrine research. Advanced Training in Endocrinology at the Royal Hobart Hospital offers a broad training experience commensurate with the Royal Hobart Hospital’s role as Tasmania’s only tertiary referral centre catering for a full range of adult medical and surgical services, women’s and children’s health and psychiatry. Trainees at the Royal Hobart Hospital therefore receive exposure to a wide spectrum of diabetes and endocrinology, including pituitary surgery.</p> <p>The Advanced Trainee in Endocrinology at the Royal Hobart Hospital is responsible for the day-to-day inpatient management of adult patients with a full spectrum of endocrine disorders and complicated diabetes.
