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## Introduction

Monash Health is the largest mental health provider in Victoria, delivering comprehensive services in both hospital and community settings including acute mental health services, alcohol and drug services, child and adolescent services, mental health community services, rehabilitation services and consumer and carer relations.

Monash Health's psychiatry program spans much of the Southern Metropolitan Healthcare region providing training across four major hospitals, Monash Medical Centre, Dandenong Hospital, Casey Hospital and Kingston Centre, as well as a multitude of outpatient services and specialist clinics. Our large network provides trainees with the opportunity to complete all their mandatory rotations and the majority of elective rotations within the health service in a diversity of settings. Monash Health provides specialist training experience in refugee mental health, addiction psychiatry, early psychosis and early intervention, perinatal psychiatry and eating disorders. Our close partnership with local regional services also allows the opportunity for trainees to work in the private health sector (St. John of God South Eastern Private Hospitals) and complete external rotations in forensic psychiatry (Thomas Embling Hospital).

Each year the Monash Health Psychiatry Training Program offers 18 Stage 1 training positions. The training offered is fully compliant with RANZCP guidelines and requirements of the Competency Based Fellowship Program. The program reflects the progressive shift of emphasis to understanding a range of psychotherapeutic practices, population health perspectives, understanding of the range of collaborative processes that support mental health service delivery, and evidence based practice.

The size of the training institution that Monash Health provides means that we can provide the diversity of experience, mentoring and role models that are critical to supporting trainees through both basic and advanced training stages. There are research programs of international standing running in child and adolescent psychiatry, general practice psychiatry, consultation liaison psychiatry and innovative approaches to cognitive behavioural therapy for depression to give only a few examples. Computer and internet access is well provided for, there are extensive training courses and other professional developmental opportunities on offer.

The training program has close linkage with Monash University through the School of Clinical Sciences, Faculty of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences, Department of Psychiatry. Monash academics are heavily involved in teaching at all levels, and so Monash Health trainees gain benefits from professional apprenticeship and mentoring from a wide range of skilled consultant staff and also the exposure to cutting edge innovations in mental health care.

## Training Committee

Training is coordinated by a dynamic team of psychiatrists and administrative staff to ensure that trainees are well supported at every stage of their training. The Director of Training oversees the whole training program and works closely with the three Site Training Coordinators to support trainees from entry to completion of training, addressing all matters related to basic and advanced training. There is also an Exam & Assessment Co-ordinator, who specifically supports written examination preparation, Clinical Competency Assessment – Modified Portfolio Review and progression through the Psychotherapy Written Case and Scholarly Project. Three senior psychotherapists provide teaching, training and supervision for all trainees commencing in Stage 1 and extending through to advanced training. They assist in preparation and supervision for the psychotherapy long case, psychotherapy advanced training requirements, as well as advanced certificate training in psychotherapy.

## Supervision

RANZCP training places great emphasis on supervision. Trainees are continuously assessed during their supervision and performance is discussed during supervisor peer supervision sessions. Any concerns are usually addressed during the rotation. Individual supervisors are encouraged to address issues before the end of the rotation and if necessary, have the assistance of the Director of Training. In addition to having a range of processes in place to monitor the provision of 1:1 supervision, we work to maximize the value for trainees of group clinical activities including ward rounds and case review meetings within community services. These meetings are part of the supervision requirements for College training.

In order for this to be a meaningful opportunity for professional development, the trainee is required to play an active part in the clinical process, in a way that conforms to the apprenticeship model and so that the trainee acquires an actual understanding of the process and practice of contributing to multidisciplinary team forums as a senior mental health clinician. Training within this organization will provide the trainee with exposure to a variety of teams and working practices, and with modelling opportunities to learn about working effectively in teams, developing a leadership style, and negotiating issues of power and responsibility. The senior medical management within the Monash Health Mental Health Program is a fresh, energetic group who provide positive and approachable role models both as clinicians and also as psychiatrists working in management capacities.

## **Educational Opportunities**

The Monash Health Mental Health Program provides a full range of educational opportunities for trainees, and space does not permit full listing of these here, however some of the key elements of training available are as follows:

### **Regular Activities:**

All basic trainees have time to attend an approved formal education course, such as the Masters of Psychiatry, on a weekly basis.

Internal activities for educational purposes include:

- A Stage 1 tutorial series is conducted on a Wednesday afternoon across Monash Health sites with a program including interview skills, phenomenology, psychopharmacology, and basic psychotherapy skills.
- Monash Medical Centre, Dandenong Hospital and Casey Hospital have an active weekly education program with journal club and case conferences alternating with a Professorial lecture, video conferenced from Monash Medical Centre to all sites.
- Exam focused tutorials occur weekly to prepare trainees for Written Examinations with opportunities to participate in mock exams.

# RANZCP PSYCHIATRIC TRAINING PROGRAM



Goulburn Valley Area Mental Health & Wellbeing Service (GVAMHWS) provides mental health care to the community in north-central Victoria, extending from the outer fringes of metropolitan Melbourne to the Murray River.

The service is predominantly based in Shepparton, a two-hour drive from Melbourne, and provides care for both inpatients and outpatients, with satellite community services in Seymour and Cobram.

GVAMHWS psychiatric training program is accredited by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP) for basic and advanced training in general adult psychiatry, psychiatry of old age, consultation liaison psychiatry and child, adolescent psychiatry and advanced training in addiction psychiatry. It is a large rural training program with fourteen Registrar positions available.

The Austin offers comprehensive training in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, with a focus on psychodynamic and systems theory, research and education. Inpatient posts are available in each of the Adolescent and Child Inpatient Units, as well as the Statewide Child & Family Centre, the first of its kind in Victoria.

Opportunities to work with adolescents and youth are available through community, autism assessment and emergency mental health service rotations. In addition to Stage 2 training, the Austin is able to offer a full Advanced Training Certificate in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, offered in collaboration with the Mindful Training Centre, Travancore.



### Adult Mental Health Services

*Clinical Director: Dr Victoria Harpwood*

Austin Health provides services to the North-East Area Mental Health Service, including the Acute Psychiatric Unit, Secure Extended Care Unit, Psychiatric Planning and Assessment Unit (PAPU) and comprehensive community mental health services, including Primary



Mental Health and HOPE teams and the first Victorian Crisis, Assessment & Treatment (CAT) Team. Residential programs at PARC and our Community Recovery Program provide experience in psychosocial rehabilitation.

### Parent-Infant & Eating Disorder Services

Parent-infant psychiatry is one of the Austin's biggest drawcards, with five registrar posts available at between the Austin, Northpark and Mercy Hospital for Women. Eating disorders experience is available on our inpatient Eating Disorders Unit, as well as the Body Image & Eating Disorders Treatment & Recovery Service (BETRS); a comprehensive community service, with day program and psychotherapy services.



### Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry

The Austin's Consultation-Liaison team provide a comprehensive training experience across all three Austin campuses to both Stage 2 and Advanced Certificate trainees. Notably, the team have a liaison role to Statewide Austin services such as Austin's Liver Transplant Unit, National Epilepsy Service, Long-Term Respiratory Unit and Victorian Spinal Unit, among other specialist services, such as the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Centre. Inter-subspecialty training experiences are also available in CL with dual-accredited roles in child and youth CL, old age CL and addiction CL, as well as perinatal CL at the Mercy Hospital for Women, just next door.

### Addiction Psychiatry

*Lead Consultant: Dr Keri Alexander*

The training opportunities in addiction psychiatry have been dramatically expanded, and now incorporates a opioid substitution clinic, consultation-liaison opportunities for inpatients, pain clinic, residential withdrawal and the new Hamilton Centre, a Statewide service offering education and support to mental health services across Northern Victoria. Addiction advanced certificate training is available; trainees will work alongside addiction medicine registrars and physicians to provide integrated dual diagnosis care. Addiction services operate out of our brand new clinic at Burgundy Street.



### Statewide Brain Disorders Program (BDP)

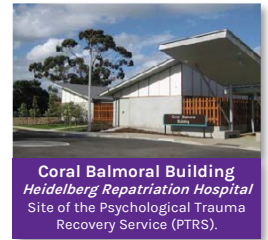

Experience in neuropsychiatry is available at the Austin's BDP, including the inpatient Brain Disorder Unit and CBDATS, a statewide community assessment and outreach service. Outpatient experience is also available in specialist Neurobehaviour Clinics. Our Transition Support Unit supports adults with a dual disability to transition to community living, providing valuable experience in the psychiatry of intellectual and developmental disabilities.

### Psychological Trauma Recovery Service (PTRS)

The PTRS is a unique Statewide service which provides inpatient and outpatient treatment to Defence Force Veterans and Serving Members, emergency services personnel, and civilian victims of trauma. Opportunities at the PTRS exist for inpatient, psychotherapy, group work, TMS, and specialised PTSD treatments. The PTRS inpatient unit, accredited as a Stage 1 acute adult rotation, allows first year registrars the rare opportunity to develop experience with high prevalence disorders.



### Available External Secondments

These include general and AT posts in Aged Psychiatry, through Northern Health, Northpark Private Hospital and The Melbourne Clinic, Forensic Psychiatry through Forensicare, as are multiple Private Practice posts.

### Education & Research Opportunities

A weekly education program includes fortnightly Grand Rounds, Professorial Tutorials, Journal Club, psychotherapy tutorials and invited expert presenters. All mandatory rotations are provided in-house.

## PSYCHIATRY TRAINING AT ST VINCENT'S MENTAL HEALTH

There are six 1<sup>st</sup> year psychiatry registrar positions with St Vincent's Mental Health for 2025. These are full-time accredited training positions.

St. Vincent's Mental Health (SVMH) emphasizes strengths and recovery opportunities for individuals experiencing mental health issues and illness. In doing so we acknowledge cultural diversity and recognize the role of psychosocial vulnerability and trauma but aim to foster a spirit of resilience which sees the individual driving their recovery professionally supported by their treating team. St Vincent's mental health includes an adult area mental health service for the inner-city areas of Yarra and Boroondara.

St Vincent's trainees have access to a wealth of specialist experiences including dual diagnosis, aboriginal mental health, psychiatry of trauma, psychotherapy, perinatal psychiatry, psycho-oncology, consultation liaison psychiatry, psychiatry of old age, and forensic psychiatry. Trainees are rotated to Austin and Eastern Health or to a new private rotation at Gertrude Street Clinic for their child and adolescent mental health experience.

St Vincent's is committed to supporting and complimenting specialist RANZCP training with the aim of developing psychiatrists with a broad range of experiences and knowledge well equipped to perform clinically as well as lead and develop the broader mental health area.

St Vincent's draws on the collegiate approach of our consultant staff to form the background to a training experience which emphasises a comprehensive and inclusive manner of understanding and treating our patients including those at the margins of our community.

There is an extensive academic and educational program available to trainees at St Vincent's Mental Health, including a particular commitment to providing a comprehensive training program which includes quality experience in psychotherapy.

Weekly reflective practice sessions are also facilitated with trainees. There is an active exam preparation program focussed on the modified essay and critical essay question exams. Psychotherapy case submissions have been supported by the provision of information tutorials to both supervisors and trainees as well as supervisor support for a double review process. Historically St Vincent's trainees have achieved high pass rates in their summative assessments and exams.

Training and working in mental health can be an intense, confronting and stressful experience. Trainees may have to deal with commitments outside of the workplace or challenges in their own lives. Part of professional development is finding a balance to these competing -and complementary- interests. In addition to meeting clinical and training supervision requirements through the usual avenues we support our trainees by ready access to senior support.

An open-door policy allows the clinical executive to provide support when needed. Our lead and senior registrars play an important role in providing mid-level and practical support to more junior trainees. St Vincent's Health provides staff support in the form of counselling services - ACCESS and STAR programs.

## On Call Structure

This model has been developed by the registrar group during 2019 with support from Barwon Health leadership. It is a "paired" model where weekday on-call shifts are paired with a weekend one. This was in response to a RANZCP audit requiring BH registrars to complete more night duties.

### Weekdays

1100 until 2200, with recall until 0830 the next day. The next day will be a rostered day off to ensure compliance with the EBA.

### Weekend/Public Holidays

Shift 1: 0830 until 1700 (no recall)

Shift 2: 1630 until 2200, with recall until 0830 the next day

Shift 3: 0900 until 1300 (covering the McKellar Wellbeing Unit for older adults)

A 'back-up on call' for the above shifts paid to be available should the initial registrar be sick/unavailable.

### Example 'Pairing' Process

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## Psychiatry Training Program First Year Registrars 2026

Northern Health Mental Health Division (NHMHD) is the 3rd largest mental health service in Victoria, located in the north and northwest of Melbourne metropolitan area. NHMHD is an accredited training program of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists and the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine. NHMHD offers a comprehensive training program including adult, older adult, child and adolescent psychiatry, indigenous, perinatal, CL and addiction mental health. Some of the NHMHD trainees are rotated to RCH and GVAMHS (Shepparton) for their Stage 2 CAP rotation. NH is a rapidly growing health organisation and provides a lot of opportunities for clinical practice, research and education.

NHMHD includes 5 services: Northwest Area Mental Health Service (NWAMHS), Northern Area Mental Health Service (NAMHS), Older Adult Mental Health (OAMH), Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (CAP) service, and the Addiction Psychiatry and Toxicology (APT) Service. NWAMHS and NAMHS has acute inpatient units (IPUs), integrated adult community mental health teams (CMHT including crisis/duty teams) and residential rehabilitation units (PARCs & CCUs). OAMH has inpatient and community assessment teams. CAP is a new and small team within NHMHD providing CL and outpatient service.

- BIPU located at the Broadmeadows Hospital
- CMHT located in Broadmeadows and Coburg
- PARC and CCU located in Broadmeadows

Besides the IPU and community services, NHMHD provides the following rotations:

- CL rotation including the experiences of consultation-liaison psychiatry, perinatal psychiatry, Emergency Mental Health in ED located in the Northern Hospital and Broadmeadows Hospital
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander mental health service in Victorian Aboriginal Health Service (VAHS) located in Preston and NAMHS located in Mill Park (community) and NPU(IPU)
- AOD service with Uniting Care Regen located in Merri-Bek (Moreland)
- Refugee MHS with Cabrini Asylum Seeker and Refugee Health Hub located in Northcote
- Orygen located in Parkville, Footscray, Sunshine, Melton and Werribee

## Stage 1 Rotations

The first-year trainees (Stage 1) start their rotation in one of our Adult Inpatient Units (NPU or BIPU) and there is a rich and intensive learning experience with our consultants and multi-disciplinary teams including nurses, OTs, SWs, psychologists, LE consultants and Aboriginal workers. During the first year, our trainees undertake foundation tutorials as a group, on interview skills, communication and mental state examination with consultant psychiatrists. Dedicated training time to attend the Formal Education Course is highly valued and protected. First year trainees benefit from both the weekly tutorials group and collegial support with the weekly service wide education sessions such as Grand Rounds, Journal Clubs and other training opportunities. They also have opportunities to attend other education/training sessions within the Northern Health. Stage 1 trainees are encouraged to attend local research projects to gain experiences for the preparation of their scholarly project.

## Stage 2 Rotations

After the first year, trainees have the opportunities to rotate to a broad range of positions that meet the RANZCP Stage 2 training requirements such as:

- Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry (CL) – The Northern Hospital and Broadmeadows Hospital
- Child & Adolescent Psychiatry (CAP) - Royal Children's Hospital (RCH or community positions in Western Melbourne), Shepparton CAP post and NHMHD CAP team
- Aged Persons Psychiatry (POA) - Broadmeadows and Bundoora Extended Care campuses

Part of the NAMHS Noogal Clinic includes MM2 area which provide trainees an opportunity to gain their experience about rural medicine.

Stage 2 trainees are encouraged to plan their psychotherapy sessions and attend local research projects to gain experiences for the preparation of their scholarly project.

Stage 2 trainees are encouraged to attend the exam preparation sessions organised by NHMHD consultants. We have highly experienced senior consultants specifically employed as coordinators to help our registrars for their clinical skill, exam preparation, Scholarly Project and Psychotherapy Written Case.

## Stage 3 Rotations & Extensive Subspecialty Training

After completing the RANZCP mandatory Stage 1 and 2 training requirements, trainees have an opportunity to experience a wide variety of general integrated adult community and residential units (PARC, CCU, and SECU) in many subspecialty areas including:

- Perinatal Psychiatry in the Northern Hospital
- Addiction Psychiatry in Uniting Care Regen or The Northern Hospital EMH/AoD service
- Youth Psychiatry at YEPP of NAMHS
- Adolescent Psychiatry at Orygen Youth Health
- Aged Psychiatry in Broadmeadows and Bundoora Extended Care campuses
- Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry - at Northern Hospital and Broadmeadows Hospital
- Private Psychiatry in local private psychiatric hospitals
- Forensic Psychiatry via Forensicare state-wide forensic MH service such as Mental Health Forensic Interface Team (MH-FIT)
- Research – in local services
- Indigenous Mental Health – via VAHS and the Northern AMHS

NHMHD offers a comprehensive training and education program for local trainees and SIMGs. During first year, our registrars undertake regular tutorials with our experienced consultant psychiatrist in the IPU. Additionally, dedicated training time to attend the FEC is highly valued and ensured on all rotations. Further training is also provided in Formulation tutorials, Examination tutorials, Psychotherapy tutorials and Leadership and Management tutorials, plus there are opportunities to complete the Psychotherapy Written Case and Scholarly Project. In the services, all teams would have access to Grand Rounds, Journal Clubs and other education opportunities. Also they would have access training and education opportunities organised by the Northern Hospital.

NHMHD registrars (local trainees and SIMGs) will join in the NH JMO family and supported by their local AMHS and the Northern Health. There are established staff supporting programs within the organisation. Staff wellbeing is the priority of the service and supported by local Director of Training. Principal Registrars in each AMHS also serve a pivotal role in supporting registrars with roster, on-call, workforce and general support with other senior registrars and the Clinical Directors.
