Summary	<p>Required Clinical year position x2: The RCY year is shared 6 months at Box Hill Hospital and 6 months at Maroondah Hospital. Both sites comprise inpatient Endocrinology Units, consultative services and outpatients clinics both on-site and off-site at the multi-disciplinary type 2 diabetes community-based IDEAS Clinics. Other clinics include a thyroid clinic, general endocrine clinics, gestational diabetes clinic, metabolic bone clinic, and a monthly evening type 1 diabetes clinic. There are weekly unit meetings, journal club and endocrine roundtable and ESAP educational meetings, monthly thyroid cancer MDMs, as well as a fortnightly Monash Partners inter-hospital meeting. It is expected that the incumbent will complete a research project and present the results at the national meeting.</p> <p>Core position x1: There are two positions that will incorporate this 6-months Core position at the Angliss Hospital. This Core position is for 6 months Endocrinology based at the Angliss Hospital, and the second 6 months (unaccredited) at Box Hill Hospital/Epworth Eastern Hospital. The Angliss Core Endocrinology Registrar will attend to all inpatient Endocrine consultative services within Angliss Hospital (no Endocrinology in-patient bedcard). There are two General Endocrinology Clinics (one at Angliss and one at Box Hill Hospital), one Gestational Diabetes Clinic, one IDEAS Clinic and a monthly evening type 1 diabetes clinic. Summary	<p>Launceston General Hospital is a busy teaching hospital in a regional city with a mix of city and country charms, nestled in the Tasmanian wilderness. This is an accredited 12-months core position, and the unit registrar will be involved with both inpatient consultation and outpatient clinics, and teaching of medical students and junior medical staff, in addition to presentation at weekly unit Journal Club meetings.</p> <p>The registrar is expected to work interactively with our multidisciplinary team consisting of four consultants, 1-2 BPT registrars, diabetes nurse educators, diabetes dietitian, nurse practitioner, podiatrists, and a psychologist. There are 4-5 clinics per week: 2 general endocrine clinics, 1-2 general diabetes clinic (young adults, Type 1 on pumps, high-risk diabetes foot, and complex other diabetes) and a high-risk antenatal clinic once a month. After-hours on-call service currently is limited to maternity patients with a roster of one week in four.</p> <p>There is also opportunity to attend outreach clinics to the East Coast of Tasmania in St Helen's, and attendance of CGMS or insulin pump start sessions.</p> <p>Our team also participates in regular pituitary MDT meetings with Royal Hobart Hospital to co-ordinate care of our patients who have had or will have their pituitary surgery in Hobart as well as coordinating the care of our patients who live more remotely.</p>
