Position Description	Albury Wodonga Health (AWH) is a unique cross- border health care service spanning the border of North-East Victoria and New South Wales providing public health care to a population of approximately 280,000. It is the second largest regional health service in Victoria and operates under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health, Victoria. It has a total of 337 hospital beds across the two hospital campuses (Albury campus and Wodonga campus) and employs over 3,300 staff and has 174 registered volunteers. In a typical year AWH provides health care to approximately 40,000 patients. With an increasing rural ageing population there is high demand for geriatric medical services. Geriatric Medicine Advanced Training (AT) at AWH offers 12 months of RACP accredited core Geriatric Medicine training. There are 6 months inpatient rotations between Acute Care for Elderly (ACE) Unit and Geriatric Evaluation & Management (GEM) unit on Wodonga campus. The training also includes ambulatory services of Fall & Balance Clinic, CDAMS, General Geriatric Clinic, Subacute at Home (GEM stream), Transitional Care Program and Rural Outreach. The trainees will see a broad case mix of all aspects of Geriatric Medicine through their training period. AWH is affiliated with the Northern Training Alliance in the Victorian Geriatric Medicine Training Program. The weekly state wide training program is protected.

We provide mentoring to trainees and there is a strong history of subsequent recruitment and retention in areas including research fellowships and new services such as community outreach and geriatricians in the emergency department.

Austin Health, as part of the Northern Training Alliance, appoints ATs in conjunction with our Northern Health and Bendigo Health, with ATs rotating between the diverse health services and campuses, providing a rich learning experience. ATs are offered a roster tailored towards

their training needs. There are three rotations of 4-months duration each year, and trainees may remain for 24 months.

Separate to the PMCV match Austin/Northern employ relievers to provide cover for annual leave and conference leave throughout the year.

We provide mentoring to trainees and there is a strong history of subsequent recruitment and retention in areas including research fellowships and new services such as community outreach and geriatricians in the emergency department.

Austin Health hosts the Fellow in Geriatric Medicine (FIGM) for the Northern Training Alliance (ATA). Educational and leadership responsibilities of this role include NTA representation in the Victorian Geriatric Medicine Training Program, organisation of state-wide, alliance and local education sessions, preparation of journal club, morbidity and mortality and unit meetings. Clinical responsibilities include aged care clinics (there is some flexibility in this role).

Under the supervision of the Divisional Structure and Geriatric Medicine Director, together with the Alliance Director of Training you will work effectively and efficiently with the multidisciplinary team to deliver excellent person-centred care. As a senior registrar, you are responsible to ensure the right patient receives the right care, at the right time, in the right environment, mindful of efficient and clinically appropriate use of healthcare resources. Your

role involves supporting your fellow trainees in this aim. As part of the multidisciplinary team you have shared responsibility for quality patient-negotiated outcomes and communication with multidisciplinary teams and carers. I

n your Fellow role (50% of your EFT) will support and provide oversight to the Advanced trainees in Geriatric Medicine across the Alliance. This position has been specifically developed to meet the increasing need for expertise in community geriatric medicine practice. It is anticipated that your timetable will include 1-2 sessions of acute/complex community assessment with in-home assessment, HIP/OPCC/ACAS/TCP Case Conferences, 1 session for triage for Aged Care Services clinics and 1 session for training as per college requirements. A Fellow in Geriatric Medicine (0.5 of the 1 EFT) is appointed to a Training Alliance to take a leadership role of trainees and to gain experience in education and the administration of a training program.

- Work with the multi-disciplinary teams caring for the patients in the Continuing Care Division to provide optimal care, including shared-decision making with patients and carers.
- The management and care for older people across the aged care continuum, capitalizing on their acute and sub-acute experience and using that integrated knowledge to inform appropriate person-centred care in the community and residential setting.

TheIntegratedCareServicesDivision

The Integrated Care Services Division offers a diverse range of programs and services which provide high quality person centred care to patients, clients, residents and consumers in Bendigo and across the Loddon Mallee Region. Services are provided in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings. Our services include; Aboriginal Services and Diversity, Allied Health, Community Programs, Health Promotion, Outpatient Rehabilitation Service, Community Dental Services, Pastoral Care and Chaplaincy Services, Rehabilitation & Geriatric Medicine, Palliative Care, Residential Care Services, Transition Care and Volunteer Services.

In addition the Executive Director Integrated Care Services has professional responsibilities as the Chief Allied Health Officer As such the CAHO is focused on leading and supporting the health professional workforce to feel valued and empowered to provide exceptional, quality care.

TheGeriatricMedicineTeam

The medical team within integrated care services include geriatricians, rehabilitation physicians, palliative care physicians, registrars and junior medical staff.

The Team look after inpatients who require ongoing assessment, evaluation and rehabilitation. This is usually after an acute illness or traumatic event, but sometimes after failing to manage in the community. The team may assist in one or more of the following outpatient clinics – memory clinic, falls and balance, comprehensive geriatric assessment, continence and telehealth reviews. The team may be rostered to assess and provide care to older adult patients in the acute wards of Bendigo Health, Residential In Reach, Transition Care Program or ACAS clients in the community.

The Positions

This position description covers the six RACP-accredited Geriatric Medicine registrar positions to be employed by Bendigo Health for the year 2026 – 2027.

Regional Training Programs offered:

4-month rotation – one AT position at Austin-Northern Health will rotate to Bendigo Health (B.H.) every 4 months (i.e., three rotations per year)

Direct appointment OR via the PMCV Match- for a one or two year AT Registrar appointment

NEW Option: 3-year program - following successful completion of 2 years training at Bendigo Health, the AT will be offered a position at Austin-Northern Health for their third year of training

Each of the Bendigo Health appointed registrars will rotate through three of the following terms in the year:

GEM Unit Geriatric Medicine Registrar (two units available);

Orthogeriatric Service Geriatric Medicine Registrar who will also provide consultation reviews to older adults in Surgical Services;

Geriatric Medicine on Acute Registrar who will combine inpatient Unit care with consultations to the Older Persons Psychiatry Inpatient Unit and General Medical Units in concert with the ED registrar;

Geriatric Medicine on E.D. providing an assessment and consultative service in ED and linking with community and the Acute Medical Services; and

Community Geriatric Medicine Registrar who provides a service to a third, smaller GEM hospital inpatient unit, as well as patients in the community, Transition Care and GEM@Home Programs.

Term allocation will be negotiated with each registrar dependent on their individual training needs, as well as organisational requirements.

Each unit is supported by either an intern or an HMO and it is the expectation that the registrar will supervise, train and support their junior medical staff.

It is expected that all registrars will work in at least one Geriatric Medicine clinic each week dependent on their training needs across the year. The selection of clinic assignment will be negotiated with each registrar and may include any of the following clinics: CDAMS, General Geriatric Medicine, Geri-Connect Telehealth service, Falls and Balance or Continence or the Movement Disorder Clinic (to be formalised in 2025).

The roles are all 42-45 hours per week, including infrequent weekend shifts, but **no** overnight cover.

It is an expectation that trainees attend the fortnightly Victorian Geriatric Medicine Training Program Thursday afternoon sessions, and other Northern Alliance of in-house training activities, including an organised registrar training program.

A Unit Handbook is available for each position.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

- Foster rapport and good communications using appropriate language, written or verbal, with the patient and other parties as required; including contact with the referring Medical Practitioner.
- Use technology appropriately, with cost benefit and potential patient benefit and complications considered.
- Appropriately liaise with all staff involved in the care of the patient, including communication and referrals necessary for ongoing care post-discharge.
- Perform certain procedures, under supervision as appropriate.
- Regularly review patient objectives, interpretative, physical and mental status, including the development and communication of a discharge plan from the time of admission.
- Counsel and support patients and their families.
- Fulfil duties as outlined in the Duty Roster of the post undertaken.
- As a representative of the Hospital and the Medical Profession, present an appearance and demeanour of professionalism at all times.
- Continually update and extend personal medical knowledge and skills, regularly attend Clinical Meetings and remain familiar with current medical literature.
- Participate in Divisional/Department/Unit Quality Improvement activities.
- Participate in teaching and educational activities as required.
- Perform other duties as agreed to and as required on occasions by Medical Administration in relation to cover of other registrars due to illness, bereavement or patient transfer.

The Aged Care Department at Eastern health provides a supportive and collegiate atmosphere focused on professional education and supervision of advanced trainees to enable them to achieve their learning goals. Eastern health Geriatricians have a diverse range of skills and professional backgrounds that can be drawn upon for advanced trainee professional development, including higher degrees in research, clinical education and leadership, and roles outside of clinical medicine such as health policy and legal aspects of medicine. The Geriatrics Department run a number of dinners throughout the year enabling education delivery and the opportunity for casual networking and support. Eastern health appoints a senior geriatrics advanced trainee to assist with journal club and advanced trainee support, with attendance at the senior medical staff meeting monthly. Opportunities exist for trainee involvement in committees and other areas of professional development. Previous geriatrics advanced trainees have contributed to falls, delirium and medical education committees, as well as discharge summary and communicating for safety working groups.

Monash Health endeavours to provide a high-quality training program in Geriatric Medicine. It offers trainees exposure to a diverse range of clinical services including:

- Orthogeriatrics service
- Medical assessment and perioperative service (MAPS)

This role involves a 6-month rotation to the Palliative Care unit at Northern Health and a 6-month rotation on the Aged Persons Mental Health Unit based at Broadmeadows Hospital.

2 ATs will be appointed and will rotate between the 2 roles to cover the year.

These positions are based exclusively at Northern Health and are not part of the rotation pool with Austin/Bendigo.

Aged Persons Mental Health Unit role:

The role is a registrar position on the Broadmeadows Older Adults Inpatient Unit, a 19-bed unit which has historically been a part of NWMH Aged Persons' Mental Health Program. In July 2023 governance for the unit transferred to Northern Health, however the 19 beds are shared between NH and RMH under a service-level agreement. Staff are employed by Northern Health and are expected to liaise with colleagues at RMH to provide high level care for consumers. There are two psychiatry consultants working on the unit along with a senior psychiatry registrar, geriatric medicine registrar and two interns. The geriatric medicine registrar is expected to have advanced skills in geriatric medicine and would be looking to further their skill set with additional training in Old Age Psychiatry.

Duties include daily review of inpatients, participation in ward rounds and coordination of discharge planning on wards. Currently, all NH older adult electroconvulsive therapy is performed at the Broadmeadows site, allowing registrars to obtain experience in the work-up of patients for ECT. Registrars are responsible for completing appropriate ward/community paperwork, discharge summaries/letters and legal paperwork required by the Mental Health Act, plus attendance at Mental Health Tribunal hearings as required. The position involves both in-hours and regular on-call out of hours duties.

Palliative Care role:

The Advanced Trainee will work with the Palliative Care multidisciplinary team to provide holistic medical care for patients referred to the Palliative Care Consultancy Team and the Palliative Care Unit inpatients, and support for their families, under supervision of the consultants.

Position Description

The Royal Melbourne Hospital provides secondary, tertiary and quaternary services to the state of Victoria and some quaternary services to interstate. The hospital is one of two trauma services in the state.
